### Components of the course

*Homework*      25% of grade

Readings and short assignments will be given most days and will usually be due at the beginning of the next class session. I'll post the homework on MyCR after class every day should you need to double-check the assignment. Working together on homework is encouraged but everyone must turn in their own assignment. If you have questions about the homework, please ask before turning it in! I'll check for questions every day before collecting homework.

One of your assignments will be to post at least twice on our class blog, the Upward Bound Language Log, about anything you notice about language or cognition. (I'll give more info about this in class.) Posting more than twice or commenting on other posts is a very good thing and will earn you some extra credit ☺.

*Midterm*      20%

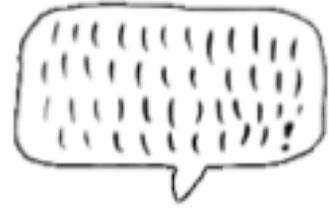
A take-home midterm will be distributed on Tuesday, July 27 and due at 9:00 am Thursday, July 29.

*Course project*      35%

The course project is to create a short digital video or audio piece to be presented at the Upward Bound Showcase and submitted to the TRIO Media Quest competition. You may work individually or in groups, and can create either (1) an original linguistics research project, or (2) a positive public message about any widely held language myth. We'll talk a lot about this project during the entire course. If you want to propose an alternate project, I'm happy to accommodate you. **Absolute deadline:** Tuesday, August 10, 5:00 pm.

*Participation*      20%

Good participation means coming to class on time every day with a positive attitude, taking part in activities, and respecting all people and ideas in class. Good participation does not mean plagiarizing, making offensive comments or jokes about any person or group, having side conversations when someone has the floor, leaving to go to the bathroom more than once a week, or having iPods or phones out during class.
